

The Four Steps to a Stunning HD Experience

Set, Source, Sound, and Setup

Along with your **BRAVIA** TV **set**, a complete HD system requires a **source** of HD programming, an HD **sound** system, and a proper connection **setup**. Refer to the Quick Setup Guide, enclosed separately, for connecting optional equipment.





When you compare a high-definition signal to a standard analog signal, you will notice a big difference in picture quality. If black bars appear as shown here, press **WIDE** on the remote control to fill the screen.


Setting Up Your TV


Some TV models are packaged with a detached Table-Top Stand so you can mount your TV to a wall right away. If you are not mounting the TV to a wall, you will need to attach the Table-Top Stand. You will need a Phillips screwdriver (not supplied) and the supplied screws to complete the task. Look for the supplied Table-Top Stand instruction leaflet.

Be sure to consider the following while setting up your TV:


- Disconnect all cables when carrying the TV.
- Carry the TV with the adequate number of people; larger size TVs require two or more people.
- Correct hand placement while carrying the TV is very important for safety and to avoid damage.
- Do not put stress on the LCD panel or the frame around the screen.


- Ensure your TV has adequate ventilation, see page 15.
- For best picture quality, do not expose the screen to direct illumination or sunlight.
- Avoid installing the TV in a room with reflective wall and floor materials.
- Avoid moving the TV from a cold area to a warm area. Sudden room temperature changes may
 cause moisture condensation. This may cause the TV to show poor picture and/or poor color.
 Should this occur, allow moisture to evaporate completely before powering the TV on.

Attaching the Table-Top Stand

Refer to the supplied Table-Top Stand instruction leaflet for proper attachment.




- Be careful to not pinch your hands or the AC power cord when you install the TV set to the Table-Top Stand.
- **1** Place the TV set on the Table-Top Stand.
- **2** Fix the TV to the Table-Top Stand using the supplied screws. The arrow marks **1** indicate the location of the screw holes used for securing the Table-Top Stand.







• Hold the TV with one hand to avoid it dropping when attaching.



- Align the TV from the top, slide it in until the guide pins cannot be seen.
- If using an electric screwdriver, set the torque at approximately 1.5 N·m {15 kgf·cm}.
- When detaching the Table-Top Stand, reverse the attaching procedure. Do not remove any screws other than those used when attaching the Table-Top Stand.

Item Description

1 VIDEO IN/ COMPONENT IN/R-AUDIO-L (MONO) This input port can be used as a composite video input (VIDEO) or as a component video input (COMPONENT). For composite use, connect the yellow jack to Y for video and use audio L (mono) and R for audio signal. For component connection, use Y, PB, PR for video signals and also connect the audio L (mono) and R for audio signal.

This TV can auto detect and switch between the VIDEO and COMPONENT when VIDEO or COMPONENT is connected.

To set to auto detection, press **HOME**, select **Settings**, and then select the **Setup** settings. Select the **Video/Component Selection** option in **AV Setup** then set to **Auto**.

HDMI IN 1 (ARC) HDMI IN 2/MHL HDMI IN 3 HDMI IN 4 HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) provides an uncompressed, all-digital audio/video interface between this TV and any HDMI-equipped audio/video equipment, such as a set-top box, DVD player, and A/V receiver. HDMI supports enhanced, or high-definition video, plus digital audio.

You can also connect your MHL (Mobile High-Definition Link) device to HDMI IN 2/MHL using an MHL cable. In addition, when you connect BRAVIA Sync-compatible equipment, communication with the connected device is supported.

If connecting a digital audio system that is compatible with Audio Return Channel (ARC) technology, use HDMI IN 1 (ARC). If not, an additional connection with DIGITAL AUDIO OUT (OPTICAL) is necessary.

3	CABLE/ ANTENNA	RF input that connects to your Cable or VHF/UHF antenna.
4	AUDIO OUT	Connects to the audio input jack of your analog audio equipment. You can use this output to listen to your TV's audio through your stereo system.
5	LAN	You can enjoy contents stored in DLNA Certified [™] devices via a network (page 41), and also IPTV, applications and Internet Browser are available.
6		Connects to the optical audio input of digital audio equipment that is PCM/Dolby Digital compatible.
7	USB	Connects to USB equipment to access photo, music, and video files. A standard USB mouse and USB keyboard can also be connected to the USB ports. An USB mouse or USB keyboard can only operate while navigating on the internet browser (page 45).



- An HDMI or Component video (YPBPR) connection is required to view 480i, 480p, 720p, 1080i and 1080p video formats. 1080/24p is available only with HDMI/MHL connection.
- Be sure to use only an authorized HDMI cable bearing the HDMI logo. We recommend that you use a Sony HDMI cable (high speed type).

Connecting the TV

Cable System or VHF/UHF Antenna System

You can enjoy high-definition and standard-definition digital programming (if available in your area) along with standard-definition analog programming.

This TV is capable of receiving unscrambled digital programming for both cable (QAM and 8VSB) and external VHF/UHF antenna (ATSC).



 It is strongly recommended that you connect the CABLE/ANTENNA input using a 75-ohm coaxial cable to receive optimum picture quality. A 300-ohm twin lead cable can easily be affected by radio frequency interference, resulting in signal degradation.

Use an optional A-B RF switch (not supplied) to switch between the cable and over-the-air antenna programming, as indicated below.






HD Cable Box/HD Satellite Box

■ Shown with HDMI Connection



MHL Device


The MHL (Mobile High-Definition Link) enables the TV to communicate with connected MHL-compatible device. When connecting MHL-compatible device, TV simultaneously charges the connected device while playing photo/music/video from it. You can use the TV remote control to control the connected MHL-compatible device.





- You can continue normal usage of the connected MHL-compatible device (such as receiving calls) depending on its capability.
- Some remote control functions may not be available depending on features of the connected MHL-compatible device. Refer to the device manual for details.
- This product is officially MHL-certified for guaranteed operation with other MHL-certified devices. If you encounter any problems when using the MHL function, consult the device manufacturer for support.
- If Auto Input Change(MHL) is set to On, the TV automatically switches to HDMI IN 2/MHL from other input when MHL-compatible device is connected to HDMI IN 2/MHL jack. The availability of Auto Input Change(MHL) depends on whether the MHL-compatible device can support this feature.
- The TV can connect to the MHL-compatible device via its MHL 2 connection.


When Installing the TV Against a Wall or Enclosed Area

Make sure that your TV has adequate ventilation. Allow enough space around the TV as shown below. Avoid operating the TV at temperatures below 41 °F (5 °C).








Never install the TV set as follows:

 Inadequate ventilation can lead to overheating of the TV and may cause TV damage or cause a fire.

Securing the TV



Sony strongly recommends taking measures to prevent the TV from toppling over. Unsecured TVs may topple and result in property damage, serious bodily injury or even death.

Preventing the TV from Toppling

- Secure the TV to a wall and/or stand.
- ☐ Do not allow children to play or climb on furniture and TV sets.
- Avoid placing or hanging items on the TV.
- Never install the TV on:
 - Slippery, unstable and/or uneven surfaces.
 - Furniture that can easily be used as steps, such as a chest of drawers.
- ☐ Install the TV where it cannot be pulled, pushed, or knocked over.
- □ Route all AC power cords and connecting cables so that they are not accessible to curious children.

Recommended Measures to Secure the TV


Consider the following measures when securing your TV to a TV stand (not supplied).

1 Secure the stand for the TV.

Make sure the TV stand can adequately support the weight of the TV. Use two angle braces (not supplied) to secure the stand.

For each angle brace use the appropriate hardware to:

- Attach one side of the angle brace to the wall stud.
- Attach the other side to the TV stand.




2 Secure the TV to the stand.


Use the optional hardware listed below (not supplied):

- Machine screw (screwed into the screw hole of the TV).
- A screw or similar (attach it to the TV stand).
- Rope or chain (strong enough to support the weight of the TV). Make sure that there is no excess slack in the rope or chain.

An alternative way to secure the TV is with an optional Sony Support Belt Kit. The Sony Support Belt Kit is available as an optional accessory, depending on your TV model.




The length of the machine screw differs depending on the rope or chain diameter. Please refer to below illustration.



3 Anchor the TV to the wall.

Anchor the TV to the wall by using bolts, wall anchor and chain (or rope).

- Securing the TV to the stand without securing the TV and the stand to the wall provides minimum
 protection against the TV toppling over. For further protection, be sure to follow the three
 measures recommended.

Running Initial Setup

During initial setup, you will perform the following:

- Set the language for the On Screen Display (OSD) text
- Choose your viewing country
- Select the type of use
- Scan for digital and analog channels
- Set the current time
- Set the network setup
- Set Automatic Software Download (page 65)

Complete your cable connections before beginning the **Initial Setup**. Refer to the Quick Setup Guide (supplied) for sample connection diagrams.



1 Turn on the TV.
The **Initial Setup** screen will appear.

2 Use the remote control buttons described below to navigate through the Initial Setup.



♦/♦/♦ buttons:

Allow you to navigate and highlight options where applicable.

button:

Allows you to select the highlighted option and advance to the next screen.

3 Auto Program will scan for available channels from the signal source directly connected to the TV's CABLE/ANTENNA input. Follow the help text provided on the screen to run the **Auto Program**.



- If you cancel the **Auto Program**, any channels you have selected are not registered. To rescan for available channels, run **Auto Program**.
- Connect either your cable or antenna to the TV (you can connect both using an A-B RF switch (not supplied)); for more details see page 11.
- **4** Set the current date and time.








To Insert Batteries into the Remote Control


Insert two size AAA batteries (supplied) by matching ullet and ullet on the batteries to the diagram inside the battery compartment of the remote control.




Guidelines to Follow



- Point your remote control directly at the IR sensor located on your TV.
- Make sure that no objects are blocking the path between the remote control and the IR sensor on your TV.
- Fluorescent lamps can interfere with your remote control; try turning off the fluorescent lamps.
- If you are having problems with the remote control, reinsert or replace your batteries and make sure that they are correctly inserted.
- Ensure that there are no objects in front of the TV.



8	RETURN	Press to go back to the previous screen or exit from the screen when displaying menu items and settings.

BRAVIA Sync Control

With the BRAVIA Sync Control function, BRAVIA Sync helps to communicate with BRAVIA Sync-compatible equipment connected with an HDMI/MHL cable. Use the following settings and tips to help unify control of your connected equipment.

- 1 Press **HOME** and select **Settings**, then select the **Setup** settings.
- 2 Select the BRAVIA Sync Settings, then highlight BRAVIA Sync Control, and set to On.

■ Controlling BRAVIA Sync-Compatible Equipment

To control the equipment by using the remote control, press **SYNC MENU** and select the desired equipment from **Device Selection**.



■ BD/DVD Player

- Automatically turns the BRAVIA Synccompatible equipment on and switches the input to that equipment when you select it from the Sync Menu.
- Automatically turns the TV on and switches the input to the connected equipment when the equipment starts to play.
- Automatically turns the connected equipment off when you switch the TV to standby mode.

AV Amplifier

- Automatically turns the connected AV amplifier on and switches the sound output from the TV speaker to the audio system when you turn the TV on.
- Automatically switches the sound output to the AV amplifier by turning the AV amplifier on when the TV is turned on.
- Automatically turns the connected AV amplifier off when you switch the TV to standby mode.
- Adjusts the volume (VOL +/-) and mutes the sound (MUTING) of the connected AV amplifier through the TV's remote control.

■ Video Camera

- Automatically turns the TV on and switches the input to the connected video camera when the connected video camera is turned on.
- Automatically turns the connected video camera off when you switch the TV to standby mode.



- BRAVIA Sync Control is only available for the connected Sony equipment that has the BRAVIA Sync or is compatible with BRAVIA Sync Control.
- The BRAVIA Sync Control settings must be set on both the TV and connected equipment. For settings on the connected equipment, refer to their instruction manuals.
- When specific Sony equipment compatible with BRAVIA Sync Control is connected, BRAVIA Sync is automatically activated on the equipment.

Using PIP Feature

PIP (picture in picture) displays a picture from a connected PC in full screen, and a TV program or other external input (see below "To Enter PIP" table) in an inset window. (**Closed Captions (CC)** is not available with **PIP** mode.)

■ To swap audio

You can swap audio between the main and sub window.

- 1 Press **OPTIONS**.
- 2 Press ♠/♦ to highlight Audio Swap and press ⊕.
- **3** Press **★/▼** to highlight the window to be audible, then press (-).

Your favorite channels and external inputs can be accessed by pressing the **HOME** button once they are added to the list.

- 1 Press **HOME**.
- 2 Press **↑/** to select **Favorites**, then press (+).



The favorites list appears.

3 Press ♠/♦ to select a channel or input, then press ⊕.

■ To add to Favorites

While tuned to the channel you want to watch or viewing connected equipment, press **HOME** and select **Favorites** to display the list. Press the yellow button to add to the list. Your newly added item will be listed at the top of the list. When you continue to add items beyond the 18th item, the item listed at the bottom of the list will be automatically removed from the list.

■ To delete from Favorites

Select the item to delete, then press the blue button.

■ To move items in Favorites

Select the item to move, then press the red/green button.

- Your Favorites list will be cleared each time you run the Auto Program.

Wide Mode

The **Wide Mode** feature allows you to select the screen display of your preference. Based on the original signal source, you may see black bars around the picture or just on the both sides of the screen. Sometimes you will see the picture filled or with the full screen. This is due to the signals your TV receives.



Inputs

Playing back Photo/ Music/Video via USB

You can enjoy photo/music/video files stored in a Sony digital still camera or camcorder through a USB cable or USB storage device on your TV.

- Photo Playback Auto Start works only for photo files in the newest digital still camera folder (DCF-compliant, highestnumbered "DCIM" folder).
- Playback may not start automatically when some digital still cameras (such as cameras with internal memory) are connected.
- The file name and folder name support only English.
- When you connect a Sony digital still camera, it is recommended to set the camera's USB connection mode to "Auto" or "Mass Storage." For more information about USB connection mode, refer to the instructions supplied with your digital camera.
- Use a USB storage device that is compliant with USB Mass Storage Class standards.

 If a selected file has incorrect container information, or is incomplete, it cannot be played back.

Viewing 3D Video (except KDL-70/ 60R520A)

You can experience powerful 3D (three-dimensional) entertainment, such as stereoscopic 3D video games and 3D Blu-ray discs with this TV and a 3D-enabled device. Use an HDMI cable or a USB cable to connect your TV to the 3D-enabled device.



- To see 3D contents, watch the TV with your eyes at the same level as the TV screen, and wear the supplied 3D glasses.
- The 3D effect will be compromised and screen color will shift if you watch the TV lying down, or with your head tilted, or view from a wide angle.
- Additional viewers with 3D glasses can also enjoy 3D content.
- You can buy commercially available Passive Polarized Glasses for 3D TV as replacement glasses or extra glasses. (You cannot use the Active Shutter 3D Glasses. Some theatrical glasses are not suitable for 3D TV.)
- The 3D function may not work properly, depending on the signal source or format.

Watching 3D Content

The 3D display mode is automatically selected when a 3D signal is detected. (only HDMI inputs) Press 3D and select **3D Display**, then press **3D** to toggles between 3D display mode and 2D display mode.



 The display mode does not change to 3D mode automatically, depending on the signal source or format. In this case, select 3D display mode manually. To prevent 3D display mode from being automatically selected when a 3D signal is detected, press HOME, then select Settings > Picture > 3D Settings > Auto 3D > Off.

Precautions

- Some people may experience discomfort (such as eye strain, fatigue, or nausea) while watching 3D video images or playing stereoscopic 3D games. Sony recommends that all viewers take regular breaks while watching 3D video images or playing stereoscopic 3D games. The length and frequency of necessary breaks will vary from person to person. You must decide what works best. If you experience any discomfort, you should stop watching the 3D video images or playing stereoscopic 3D games until the discomfort ends; consult a doctor if you believe necessary.
- The vision of young children (especially those under six years old) is still under

- development. Consult your doctor (such as a pediatrician or eye doctor) before allowing young children to watch 3D video images or play stereoscopic 3D games. Adults should supervise young children to ensure they follow the recommendations mentioned above.

Home Network

Connecting to a Home Network

You can enjoy various content (e.g. photo/music/video files) stored on DLNA Certified™ media servers. The home network feature allows you to enjoy network content in other rooms.

■ Playing photo/music/video

- Press HOME, then select Media > Photo, Music or Video > the desired media server.
- 2 Select files or folders to play from the list



- The server is required to be DLNA Certified™.
- Files from a network device need to be in the following formats:
 - Still images: JPEG
 - Music: MP3, linear PCM, WMA
 - Video: AVCHD, MPEG2, MPEG1, MP4 (AVC), MP4 (MPEG4), WMV
- Depending on the file, playback may not be possible even when using the supported formats.

Renderer

You can play back photo, music and video files stored in network devices (e.g. digital still cameras, mobile phones, PC) on the TV screen by directly operating the target device. The network should also be renderer-compatible.

■ Adjusting the renderer settings

Press HOME, then select Settings >
Setup > Network > Home Network
Setup > Renderer > the desired setting.

Display Settings for Media Servers

Select home network servers to be displayed in the Home Menu. Up to 10 servers can be displayed in the Home Menu automatically.

- Press HOME, then select Settings > Setup > Network > Home Network Setup > Show/Hide Media Servers.
- 2 Select the server to display in the Home Menu.

Using Screen mirroring

"Screen mirroring" is a function to display the screen of a mobile device on the TV by Miracast technology.

The TV can be connected directly with a Screen mirroring compatible device (e.g. smartphone, PC). You can enjoy the display screen of the device on your large TV screen. No wireless router (or access point) is required to use this feature.

- 1 Press the **INPUT** button, then select **Screen mirroring**.
- 2 Operate the Screen mirroring compatible device to connect with the TV.

When the device is connected with the TV, the screen displayed on the device will also be displayed on the TV. For details, refer to the instruction manual of the device.

To list connected devices/deregister devices

When the standby screen for the Screen mirroring is displayed, press the **OPTIONS** button, then select **Show Device List / Delete**.

To deregister a device, select the device in the list to delete, then press the \oplus button. Then, select **Yes** in the confirmation display.

To deregister all devices, press the **OPTIONS** button in the list, select **Delete All**, then **Yes** in the confirmation display.

■ To display dialog when attempting to connect a device with the TV

Activating this function can avoid an unintended device from being connected.

When the standby screen for the Screen mirroring is displayed, press the **OPTIONS** button, then select **Registration Notification** > **On**.

Note that once you decline registration request from a device, you will not be able to connect the device unless you delete it from the device list.

To connect the declined device, press the **OPTIONS** button, select **Show Device List / Delete**, then delete the declined device. Then, make a new connection with the device.

Photo Frame

You can enjoy looking at a photo, listening to music, or the clock and calendar, at the same time.





Type 2: Secured network without Wi-Fi Protected Setup™ (WPS)

To set up a wireless LAN, SSID (wireless network name) and security key (WEP or WPA key) will be required. If you do not know them, consult the instruction manual of your router.

- 2 IP Address setting/Proxy server:
 - automatic setting:

 This may take several minutes. You cannot cancel the diagnosis after selecting Check Connection.

Adjusting the Server Display Settings

You can select home network servers to be displayed on the Home Menu. Up to 10 servers can be displayed in the Home Menu automatically.

- 2 Select Show/Hide Media Servers.
- 3 Select the server you want to display on the Home Menu, and adjust the settings.

If you cannot connect to your home network

The TV detects if the server is being correctly recognised when you cannot connect it to your home network. If the diagnostic results indicate a failure, check possible causes, and network connections and settings.

■ Things to consider

- Check the input selection by pressing the **INPUT** button. You may be watching the wrong input.
- If you cannot hear sound from the TV, you may have accidentally pressed the MUTING button on your remote control; press the MUTING button again or press VOL + to deactivate muting.
- If the remote control is not functioning properly, the batteries may be installed incorrectly or may be low or an object or light may be interfering with the remote control.
