

2 Getting Started

Installing the SIM Card and the Battery

When installing a SIM card, ensure that the golden contact area on the SIM card is facing downward and that the beveled edge of the SIM card is properly aligned with that of the SIM card slot.



Removing the Battery and the SIM Card

Before removing the battery and the SIM card, ensure that your phone is powered off.



Installing a microSD Card






You can install a microSD card to expand the memory capacity of your phone. When inserting the microSD card, ensure that the golden contact area on the microSD card is facing downward.

Charging the Battery

To charge the battery, do the following:

- 1. Connect the smaller end of the USB cable to the charger jack on the phone and the larger end to the charger.
- 2. Connect the charger to a power socket.



- Wait until the battery is fully charged. During charging, an animated charging icon is displayed. When the charging icon is static, the battery is fully charged.
- 4. Disconnect the charger from the power socket, and then from the phone.

Calibrating the Screen

Once calibrated, the phone will respond accurately to your touch on the screen.

Accessing Shortcuts

At the bottom of the home screen, there are several default shortcuts. You can:

- Tap voi to access **Camera** where you can take pictures or record video clips.
- to access **Bluetooth** where you can exchange data Tap with other Bluetooth devices or connect a Bluetooth headset to vour phone.
- Tap log to access My file where you can organize the files stored on your phone and microSD card. You can also view images and photos, or listen to your music and ebooks.
- Tap will to access Alarm where you can set alarms.

If you touch and hold a shortcut for 3 seconds, an option box is displayed. Choose Remove shortcut to delete the shortcut, or choose Replace shortcut and select another shortcut from a list to replace the original one.

Navigating the Main Menu

To navigate the main menu:

- 1. In standby mode, tap
- 2. Flick your finger left or right, and tap the desired application.
- 3. Flick your finger up or down, and tap the desired option.



4. Tap **Back** or **D** to return to the previous menu, or tap



to return to home screen.

Accessing Applications

Flick your finger left or right to view other parts of the home screen. These extensions to the home screen provide more space for widgets, shortcuts, and other items.

Shortcuts

Tap to add features as shortcuts and arrange them in a list. You can access an application quickly by tapping the corresponding shortcut. Press and hold a shortcut to remove or replace it.

Image viewer

View images stored in your phone or memory card. Flick to switch between images. Tap one of the icons below the current image to configure the relevant settings.

Favorite contacts

Tap to add favorite contacts to the home screen. Once a contact is added, you can add a photo caller ID for the contact

by tapping La, call the contact, or send a message to the contact from the home screen.

Weather

You can view weather forecast for the next five days.

Media player

Tap 4 to view audio clips, and flick your finger up or down to switch between them.

Message viewer

View abbreviated messages in your **Inbox**. Flick your finger up and down to scroll through the current messages. Tap an abbreviated message to view the full version. Tap the relevant icon below the current message to write, reply to, or delete a message.

Recent calls

View all calls, those made, received and missed. You can also make a call, send a message, add a contact, or replace an existing contact from this call record.

Shell settings

Turn Bluetooth and Wireless Fidelity (Wi-Fi) on or off, activate a profile, and configure settings such as **Auto keypad lock**, **Wallpaper**, and **Brightness**. You can also turn **Shortcuts**, **Image** viewer, **Weather**, **Media player** and **Recent calls** on or off.


Phone Lock

The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. By default, the phone lock is disabled. Once the phone lock is enabled, you must enter the password each time you power on the phone.

To enable the phone lock:



- Tap and select Settings > Security settings > Phone security > Phone lock.
- 2. Tap the text box to open the onscreen keypad.





You can change the preset password (**1234**) to any numeric string of four to eight digits.

To change the phone code:



- Tap and select Settings > Security settings > Phone security > Change password.
- 2. Tap the text box to open the onscreen keypad.
- 3. Enter the old password, tap





5. Enter the new password again to confirm it.

If you forget your password, contact your service provider.

Mass Storage

When you have connected your phone to a computer using the USB cable, a series of options, including **Mass storage**, are displayed on the phone screen.

Tap **Mass storage** to manage the files stored in the phone memory or on the microSD card using the computer's file manager application.

The phone memory and its microSD card are displayed as removable disks on the computer. You can:

- Double-click a disk to open it.
- · Copy, paste, or delete files.
- · Disconnect the phone from the computer.
 - Ensure that you connect and disconnect the USB cable properly.
 - Do not run the formatting command on the computer to format the phone memory; doing so may permanently damage the phone memory.
 - You can transfer data and charge the battery by connecting the phone to the computer with the USB cable.

PIN and PUK

m

The personal identification number (PIN) protects your SIM card from unauthorized use.

If you incorrectly enter the PIN a specified number of times, the PIN is blocked and the phone prompts you to enter the PIN unblocking key (PUK). If this occurs, enter the PUK to unblock the blocked PIN. If you incorrectly enter the PUK a specified number of times, the SIM card will become permanently invalid, and you must contact your service provider for a new SIM card.

Both the PIN and the PUK are provided with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

The PIN lock for each SIM card must be configured separately.

To enable the PIN lock:

- Tap is and select Settings > Security settings > SIM1/SIM2 security > PIN lock.
- 2. Tap the text box to open the onscreen keypad.
- 3. Enter the PIN, tap 📩, then OK.


Locking the Screen

To lock the screen, press $\, {igleven} \,$ in standby mode. To unlock th<u>e scr</u>een,

press any key to turn on the backlight, and slide 📕

If the auto screen lock function is enabled, the phone will automatically lock the screen after being idle in standby mode for a pre-defined period.

To enable the auto screen lock function, tap **usect Settings** > Security settings > Auto keypad lock, and then select the desired duration.



Voice Services

Making a Call

- 1. In standby mode, tap 💟 to open the onscreen keypad.
- There are two onscreen keypads, Predictive input onscreen keypad and Multi-tap input onscreen keypad. The Multi-tap input onscreen keypad is by default. When opening the onscreen keyboard, tap Options > Dialler search, then select On to open

the Predictive input onscreen keypad or touch then tap Options > Dialler search and Off to open the Multi-tap input onscreen keypad.

- When entering phone numbers, the Predictive input onscreen keypad can automatically match and display the contact name or number from your phonebook and call history. The Multi-tap input onscreen keypad hasn't this feature.
- 2. Enter a phone number.
- To make an international call, tap twice to enter the plus sign (+). Then enter the country or region code, area code, and phone number.
- To call an extension, enter the phone number, tap times to enter P, or four times to enter W, and enter the extension number.

- Remove all recipients: removes all recipients from receiving the message.
- Save: saves the message to Drafts and exits the Write message screen.

Sending a Multimedia Message



- Tap and select Write message.

- 3. Tap **Options** for the following options:
- Add picture: adds a picture to the message.
- Add sound: adds an audio file to the message.
- Add video: adds a video file to the message.
- Add subject: adds a subject to the message.
- Slide options: adds a presentation slide to the message or sets the playing interval between presentation slides.
- Switch to MMS: changes from a text message to a multimedia message.

If you select **Add picture**, **Add sound**, **Add video**, or **Add subject**, the message automatically changes from a text message to a multimedia message.

- 4. On the Write message screen, tap Options, and select Send to.
- Tap Enter recipient and enter the recipient's phone number; or tap Add from Phonebook and add a recipient from the phonebook.
 Repeat this step to add multiple recipients.
- Scroll to the desired recipient and tap **Options** for the following options:

- Send options: sets the sending options.
- Edit recipient: allows you to change the recipient.

- Change to Bcc: blind copies the message to the recipient.
- Save to Drafts: saves the message to Drafts and exits the Write message screen.
- By default, multimedia messages are stored in the phone memory.
 - Contact your service provider to determine the availability of the Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS) and how to subscribe to the service.
 - Your phone supports multimedia messages up to 300 KB.
 - Open multimedia messages with caution. Objects in multimedia messages may contain viruses and malicious software that can damage your phone.

Backing Up or Restoring Text Messages and Multimedia Messages

To back up text messages:

To restore text messages:

The operation of backing up and restoring multimedia messages is similar. Select Message > Message settings > Multimedia message > Multimedia message backup and restore > Multimedia message backup or Multimedia message restore to back up or restore multimedia messages.



The backup function is available when a micro SD card is installed.

Viewing Received and Sent Messages

By default, all messages are displayed as conversations. To view them,

tap use contact and solved by time.

To switch from **Conversations** mode to **Inbox** and **Sent messages** mode:

- 1. Select Message > Message settings > Conversations.
- 2. Tap Off.

- When a message is received, an icon is displayed in the status bar. This icon indicates whether the message is a text message or a multimedia message and whether the message received from SIM1 or SIM2.
 - When a message is received, press to return to the standby mode. Select View to view the message, or select Back to read the message at a later time. You can find the message in Conservations or Inbox.

The media player plays audio clips stored in the All songs folder and video clips stored in the All videos folder in the phone memory or on the microSD card. To obtain better sound quality, it is recommended that you use the headset to listen to audio and video clips.

To play an audio or video clip:

2. Select Now playing, and tap Lee to start playing the audio or video clip. You can also select and play a new audio or video clip not listed in Now playing.

When the audio or video clip is plaving:

- Press to adjust the volume.
- Tap and to switch between clips.

- Tap to go back to the previous menu.

All audio and video files are automatically added to the media player. To add an audio or video file to the media player manually:

Media player only supports audio and video files in .mp4, .3qp, .mp3, .amr and .wmv formats. Files in other formats may not play properly.

Image Viewer

To access the image viewer, tap 🕮, select **Camera**, and then tap

. You can also tap 🕮 and select **Image viewer** to access this function

The image viewer allows you to manage all pictures stored in the phone memory or on the microSD card.



- View, edit, rename, and delete a picture.
- View picture information.
- ٠ Delete all pictures.
- Send a picture via MMS, Bluetooth, or email.
- Use a picture as the wallpaper, screen saver, power-on or off display, or photo caller ID.
- Sort pictures by name, type, time, or size
- Select the preferred storage for pictures.

Tap 🔁 to go back to the previous menu.

Photo Editor

- 2. Select Photo artist or Image tiles.
- Edit the image.

You can adjust the image size, and add text, a frame, or a seal to the image.

Select Options > Save as to save the image.

FM Radio

The headset cable also functions as an antenna when the FM radio is turned on. To ensure good radio reception, do not disconnect the headset from the phone or severely bend the headset cable.

To listen to the radio:

- 1. Connect the headset to the phone.
- 2. In standby mode, tap 🕮 and select FM radio. When listening to the radio:
- Tap U to turn the FM radio on or off.
- Tap 💽 to record the current radio program.
- Press U to adjust the volume.
- Tap or to adjust the frequency in increments of 0.1 MHz
- Tap \leftarrow or \leftarrow to switch between channels.




